This print-based directory falls under the Housing Supports and Information Priority of the NB Inclusive Housing Solutions Roadmap. We hope a student will work with the Board on this project.

Due to the size of the province, alignment with L'Arche Saint John may be the best way to expand L'Arche in New Brunswick. Both Boards are small with eight and 10 members. The skills and expertise we have if combined could impact greater effects on us as one. In L'Arche the mission is relationship and we can live this in New Brunswick.
